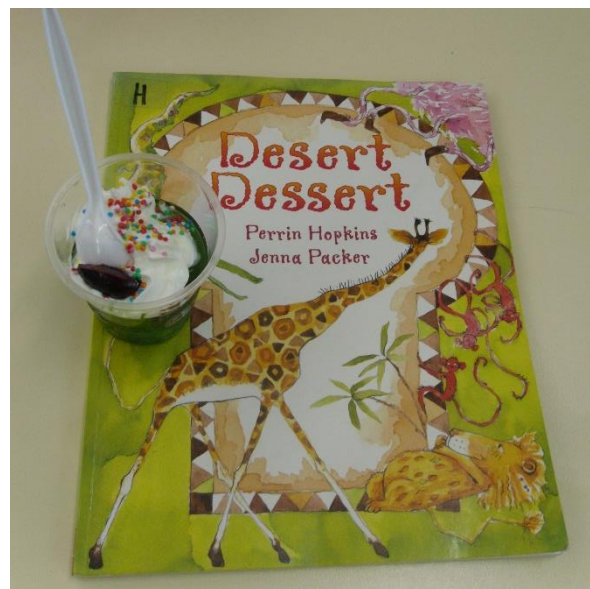
Eungai Public School Athletics Carnival

Last term Eungai Public School participated in the school athletics carnival at Uncle Ritchie's oval at Scotts Head. Everyone had a great day and a few students even broke records. In the junior boys Shot Put, Dominic, Saxon and Owen all broke the 12 year old shot put record but Dominic now holds the new record at 6.52m beating the old record by 53cm. In the junior boys Discus, Owen broke an 18 year old record by throwing 17.28m, 12 cm further than the previous record and Taya broke the 11 year old girls Discus record by 1.05m, setting a new record of 14.04m. 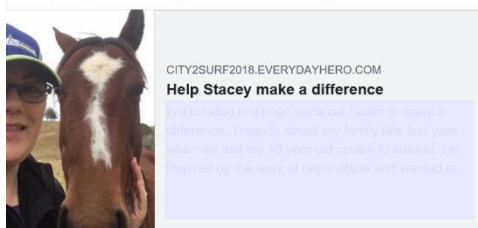
